1379 | Approval of Minutes

1380 Matters arising from the minutes/Points of Information

- No interest has been received in response to the Flood Warden training and recruitment article in HEDS
- Cllr. Upton has added an article to the website encouraging young people to consider becoming a Youth Representative for the Parish. It was agreed to also put a similar article in January's edition of HEDS.
- Cllr. Wiles has passed on concerns discussed at last month's meeting about speeding on Mattersey Road. Highways will look into these.

1381 Highways Matters

a) Cllr. Wiles reported that there was a lack of diversion signs on the A631 during the road closure due to flooding problems in Bawtry and reported this to NCC several times but was not rectified in time. Fortunately the flooding near rail bridge subsided relatively quickly.

There was a general discussion about what the review of the neighbourhood plan should consider and this included taking into account new ways of working such as from home. There was concern that several planning applications are amended after original approval often to the detriment of green credentials.

1384 | Planning Enforcement Update

The planned meeting with Bassetlaw District Council took place 20th October 2023. At the meeting the Parish Council expressed its concerns about the long outstanding cases and conveyed how this, in some cases, were adversely affecting the community. Updates on outstanding cases were presented by BDC Enforcement and Environmental Health services along with proposed actions. It was agreed to request a detailed update on the outstanding environmental issues linked to one of the cases.

It was noted that there are a few advertisements appearing on lampposts in Everton. Cllr. Pashley confirmed that these could be taken down.

35 Day Notice Account

After comparing AER interest on various accounts, it was agreed to open a 35-day notice account with Natwest which currently yields 3.25% AER interest a year. This compares to the instant access reserve account which yields 1.46% AER.

1387 Risk Review and Asset Inspection

- The repair work to the kissgate on Chapel Lane has not yet been completed, but is expected to be carried
 out imminently.
- A 30-mph sign, a footpath sign and bend sign on Eel Pool Road has been damaged. Clerk to report to Highways
- The BDC road sweeper has recently visited the parish responding to a request from Cllr. Pashley. It was commented that leaf fall clearing may be needed and agreed to keep this under review.
- It was noted that there appeared to be an increasing amount of dog fouling about. It was agreed to put an article in HEDS about clearing up after your dog.

1388 Footpaths and Public Rights of Way

The wooden sign post near the Church field is on NCC's list to be reinstated and will be dealt with once the new PROW Officer is appointed.

1389 Canine Seasonal Illness

Some concern was expressed about cases of Canine Seasonal Illness locally and the lack of signs at the entrances to the woods. It was thought that there were some signs in the woods. As the season for this year was at an end, it was agreed to bring up again before the start of the season next year.

1390 | Recent Surface Water Flooding

- Some fields near the river Idle, parts of Eel Pool Road and bottom of the Carrs have been flooded to some degree.
- The sewer system was backed up in some areas
- No volunteers have yet come forward to become a nominated Flood Warden. Cllr. Wiles to put his name forward.

1391 | Parish Council Website

It was agreed to put a separate article in HEDS about the new Parish Council website. There was a general discussion about how best to communicate with residents including the pros and cons of using Facebook. Agreed to discuss further at a future meeting.

1392 Christmas Event and Christmas Tree

Arrangements for the event are falling into place and will take place on 15th December at 6pm. Discussions with the Choirmaster and the Church Warden have agreed there will be a different programme this year, carol singing mainly inside the church, following the Christmas tree light switch in. Refreshments will be available in the church after the carol singing. Cllr. Wiles asked for volunteers to help out on the night.

Resolved: to purchase a real, 3 metre Christmas tree at a cost of £225.00. Cllr. Troop would collect it.

1393 Farmland Rent Review

A follow up rent review letter to be sent to the Parish Council's farmland Tenant setting out the rent increase for 2024/25.

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1394	Acquisition of Cemetery Land
	Cllr. Wiles has been in further discussions with the Environment Agency/Via Consultants. The EA has reviewed requirements that landowners have to meet. These have now been scaled down. Viaem are looking into this further but it is thought that the Tier 1 work ticks most of the boxes. The Parish Council will still need to demonstrate what the groundwater table is. The site may qualify for an exemption; 1 bore hole at the lowest level would be needed to ascertain whether the site can be exempt. An estimate of £12,500 has been obtained for this work. The estimate is based on previous competitive quotes received for the site. The NCC Via Environmental Consultants system for ensuring a competitive, quality tendering processed was outline.
	Resolved : to defer decision until next meeting to allow absent members to contribute to the discussions. An estimate of potential overall costs was requested from the sub-committee to help members make an informed decision.
