The Curate writes

As I write this on a cold and grey January morning, I long for the warmth and light of spring after a cold dark winter. We've spent weeks enjoying, celebrating and gathering around the lights of church, home and high street, and as the lights have come down and been packed away until next Christmas, somehow the days themselves can feel darker.

The Christmas season brings with it much talk of hope, looking back to the promises of a faithful God to people across time and history, and forward to what is promised in the fullness of time. That can seem a far and distant dream, a hope that is beyond our grasp as we grapple today with financial, relationship and worldwide struggles and uncertainty.

We don't need to look very far for the darkness of a selfish and inward-looking world, where neighbour is often pitted against neighbour through circumstance or choice, and hope, that word and idea that the Christian faith dangles in front of us, seems elusive and fragile.

And yet, the Christian hope is anything but those things. Also as I write, we are about to embark on a journey into hope as we start the Hope Explored course in Bawtry; it's tagline asks us that important question: "What's the best future you could ever imagine?"

It speaks of the invitation into hope we can accept and embrace through our relationship with Jesus and one another; 'a joyful expectation for the future, based on true

events in the past, which changes everything about my present'.

Isn't that hopeful? Something, or perhaps more accurately, someone, who offers concrete and tangible hope, something we can cling onto and live with day by day, because the future events we often worry about are secure through the promises of Jesus and the hope that comes from the power of God at work in the world.

Day to day troubles will hit us from unexpected and unplanned places and people, just as they have done to every person throughout time. But the hope which the Christian faith offers is deep enough and strong enough to keep our heads and hearts looking forward and our souls alive.

Now I can simply tell you this, or you can experience it for yourself, because the hope I'm talking about is not contingent on any human with their own agenda or something to gain, but on God, who gave up everything to tell us that hope and trust in him and his life is only ever for our good and for the good of all people.

So, as you see tangible signs of hope in your gardens this coming spring, lighter and warmer days and maybe think on the hope Jesus offers us, I hope that it will give you life and fill you with peace, not simply the absence of conflict, but a deep knowing that in the words of Christian mystic Julian of Norwich; "all shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well". And, in the words of St Paul, "may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit". (Romans 15:13)



DONCASTER SHEFFIELD AIRPORT

The start of a new year used to be a time of renewed hope and optimism, however it all felt a bit flat with the arrival of 2025. Top topics at this time of year are usually about proposed “jollidays” and many had hoped that DSA would see commercial flights to holiday destinations in Summer 2025. Sadly, this all proved to be a forlorn hope. However, where are we with the rejuvenation process of our local airport?

Other Navajo flights are planned in the coming months. 2Excel has maintained its commercial interest in DSA and has an operation in 3 hangar which it has maintained since the airfield closure in 2022.

We are promised more information from Doncaster Council in early 2025. Fingers crossed it's all good news.

Well Spring/Summer is the latest rumour for the commencement of holiday flights. I say rumour because there is still a veil of secrecy regarding the airfield's future operator. £3 million has been made available to start work and process the relicensing of the airport with the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA). This will be a complex and expensive undertaking.

On the bright side, a light twin engine Navajo of 2Excel landed at DSA in early December. As the runway is still unlicensed, it was a positioning flight only. No passengers or freight could be carried.

CLEANER SWEEPS

Friends of Everton Cemetery & Mattersey Road Cemetery

For the past two years, the Friends of Everton Cemetery group has been assisting the Parish Council in maintaining the Mattersey Road Cemetery. This small but dedicated group of volunteers has contributed a little of their time and effort to care for this important space.

One of the group's significant achievements is the restoration of the original feature on the war memorial, a Grade II listed structure. This project involved replacing the ornamental spheres and base plates, made possible with a grant from Bassetlaw District Council.

The group has also undertaken periodic visual safety inspections of the masonry gravestones and arranged for necessary safety work in collaboration with the maintenance contractor. Several tidy-up sessions have been organised to cut back overgrown shrubs and vegetation, enhancing the cemetery's appearance. Additional efforts include repairing the gateway, installing information signs, and carrying out minor repairs to the Peace Garden wall. The group also reinstated water provision by repairing the water butt.

A tree survey has been commissioned to ensure the public's safety and essential tree work will be scheduled, subject to Parish Council approval.

Through their ongoing efforts, the Friends of Everton Cemetery have made a significant difference to the cemetery's upkeep while saving the Parish Council several thousand pounds.

If this initiative appeals to you, the group warmly welcomes new volunteers. This is an informal group, and no specific skills are required—just a willingness to lend a hand. For more information, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Church Electoral Roll 2025


